ARTIST OF THE MONTH

December's Featured Artist Cheryl Graham

Cheryl and her husband Jerry have lived in Oregon for thirty years. Growing up in California, her love for art led her to study at the California College of Arts and Crafts in Oakland, and soon after she became an elementary school teacher who used her talent, making puppets, posters, and other artwork to further engage with her students.


Now retired, Cheryl often works in landscapes. "While painting my favorite 'get away spots,' I reimagine and honor my encounters with creation." She hopes her art recalls to viewers the awe and delight they first felt as they viewed certain locations. Last year she made 100 paintings for the 20-Dollar Art Show at the High Desert Art Museum. This year she created an on-site, here-and-now art experience for visitors where she painted South Sister, Mount Bachelor, or Broken Top in the colors people requested. As someone who loves to volunteer and build community, part of the joy of painting for Cheryl is seeing people's faces as they react to her work.

This fall, Cheryl rose to the challenge when invited to participate in a show in Portland that featured birds of the Pacific Northwest. "I love looking at birds in my yard or in nature, but I always allow myself creative license to give these paintings more character and surprising color combinations."

Other recent shows include the monthly First Friday Art Walks. Cheryl shares her love of teaching and painting with various "Sip and Paint" classes. She also volunteers by hosting art classes for homeless women. "I am really surprised at how much untapped talent there is out there. I love sharing with people who, for a variety of reasons, haven't had a chance to try their hand at painting or collage. It's such a deep way of communicating without words."

2025 DCAA Fall Show & Sale: A Record-Breaking Weekend!

The 2025 Fall Show & Sale was a *streaming success*, setting new records across the board! With **43** booths and **52** artists, this year's event drew over **2,000** visitors—our highest attendance yet.

Our raffle also reached new heights, with **65 donated pieces from 57 artists**, raising an incredible **\$4,616** to support DCAA programs. The **High School Student Zone** saw its strongest participation to date, featuring work from more than **30 student artists**.

Visitors shared their enthusiasm for the developing **Dry Canyon Community Art Center**, and many stopped by the DCAA info booth to pledge additional support for both the **JumpStart Art** program and the new center.

A heartfelt thank-you goes to Janet Hardwick, our volunteer coordinator, and the **30+ volunteers** who made the event run smoothly—from artist load-in and booth support to greeting guests and event wrap-up. DCAA is deeply grateful to everyone who contributed their time, energy, and talents.

Day Canyon Arts Association recently received some good news from the Autzen Foundation. They granted us \$5,600 to help fund the Jumpstart Art program for the upcoming year. DCAA initiated Jumpstart Art last year in the eight Redmond School District Elementary Schools. All students in grades K-5 participated in hands-on visual art

education session in their classrooms taught by an Artist-in-Residence. A culminating activity was held for parents and the community to view the students' artwork.

Disbursements from Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) IRA Accounts

Individuals aged 70½ or older can direct RMDs from traditional IRAs to nonprofit organizations, potentially reducing taxable income.

DAF Accounts are Becoming More Popular for Tax Advantaged Giving

Donor-advised funds (DAFs) offer several benefits, including an immediate tax deduction when you contribute, the potential for tax-free growth on contributions, and flexibility in deciding when to grant funds to charities. Check with your financial advisor on how to set up.

Oregon Cultural Trust Tax Credits – This is a Biggie in Oregon - https://www.culturaltrust.org/get-involved/donate/

- Oregon residents can receive a tax credit off state taxes by donating to Oregon Cultural Trust listed cultural organizations and donating an equal amount to OCT by December 31. Tax credits up to \$500 for individuals, \$1,000 for couples filing jointly, and \$2,500 for class C-corporations.
- Maximizes the value of your contribution while supporting arts and culture statewide.

Other Effective Donation Methods

- Workplace Giving: Many employers match employee donations to eligible nonprofits, doubling or even tripling the impact.
- Stock Gifts: Donate appreciated securities for potential tax benefits and significant support.
- Legacy/Bequest Giving: Include the art center in your will or estate plan to leave a lasting legacy.
- In-Kind Donations: Contribute goods, services, or equipment that support operations and programming.



ART THERAPY

Excellence

Imagine a situation in which an individual lives alone on a tropical mountaintop for an indefinite period. The person constructs a durable residence with no expectation of visitors yet invests considerable time and effort in designing the living space. Each element, including woodwork, tableware, and furnishings, is meticulously chosen to align with personal preferences.

This process reflects the essence of outstanding artistry: creating for its own sake, guided by personal vision and dedication within a specific context. Making art demands commitment and serves as a unique expression of one's pursuit of excellence, shaped by individual benchmarks rather than outside pressures.

Art is mostly made for the artist's fulfillment. Judging what qualifies as excellence remains subjective—just like art itself—with no universal standards. In this sense, the creator often becomes his/her own chief critic.

The line between a 'formula' work approach and authentic artistic expression is blurred. When creations strictly follow popular trends, they can lack originality and struggle to make a real impact. Ultimately, the creator's own satisfaction is the best predictor of how well the audience might receive the work.

Hurdles like fear of criticism, commercial goals, comparisons with past successes, and constraints on resources can draw focus away from the main aim of delivering exceptional results. Achieving true greatness means staying resolutely focused on quality without compromise.

In deeply creative projects, it's vital to keep our internal dialogue aligned with pure artistic purpose. Setting the bar at excellence not only improves the project but can also enhance life overall and inspires others to reach higher.

Excellence is not a matter of public recognition or widespread acclaim, but rather the quiet satisfaction that comes from knowing one has given his/her utmost effort. The journey toward mastery involves embracing both the challenges and joys inherent in the creative process, often requiring resilience and self-motivation when external validation is absent.

Keep this thought: "I am just here to create."
